**Spills**: All FD employees are trained to respond to minor operations. HAZMAT and ERG staff respond to larger spills, which are also reported to the State Watch Office. Response includes diking and controls to prevent spills from reaching the stormwater system. FDOT SERV also has all diking material. Contaminated materials are disposed of by Palm Beach County or a contracted HAZMAT company.

Maintenance yard has socks to protect storm drains from potential spills.

**Training**: All Fire Department employees are trained annually 6 hours HAZMAT. Shon tracks training on LMS Target Solutions.

Thirteen City employees attended the NPBCID annual training, sign in sheet provided. Also using illicit discharge videos (in English and Spanish), PSAs (30 seconds, 5 minutes, 15 minutes) for employee training. The 30 second PSA is also broadcasted on cable, and linked on the City website for public and employee access.
