II. GENERAL COMMENTS

Rex Taylor was MS4 Coordinator, and retired. Jim Pascale was the new coordinator; however, he recently left the Town. Engenuity Group represented the Town during the audit. Engenuity will be assisting with the NPDES program while the Town hires a new Town Manager.

The Town is approximately 0.62 miles long. The only public road is Ocean Drive, which is maintained by FDOT. The Town has private condominiums, which have private stormwater systems. The Town's stormwater structure includes a parking lot which discharges to the Intracoastal Waterway (Lake Worth Lagoon) at Town Hall/Police Station. The parking lot is video monitored 24-hours a day.
