Previously used a paper inspection sheet. Reviewed summary of inspections. Staff schedules structure cleaning based on zones. If a problem found during an inspection, field staff create a work order. Reviewed monthly report with comments for maintenance needed. To reduce their Community Rating System (CRS) score, the Town inspects the conveyance system annually (pipes, catch basins, swales) in certain areas of the Town. The town also inspects private systems and report issues to the system owner. The Town inspects private systems as part of their stormwater fees
