Volunteers (69) collected litter along roads throughout whole City; 400 pounds of trash, 50 pounds of recycling. International Coastal Cleanup: City partners with the Solid Waste Authority. Reviewed a photo of participants. Street Sweeping: The City does not own any curb and gutter roads. State and county roads within the City are not maintained by the City. Road Maintenance Yards: Maintenance Shop is used to store vehicles, mowers, paint storage, and for vehicle maintenance. Reviewed the inspection checklist which includes stormwater elements and a daily inventory check.
