<b>Major Outfall Inventory</b> : 2 major outfalls. Map also included all outfalls and other structures. It was not clear which structures were owned by the Town. Outfalls often submerged during high tide. Some have Red Valve check valves.						

**Structural Control Inventory**: Not reporting dry detention, exfiltration, or pipes in annual report.

Dry detention: At Woolbright Rd.

**Swales**: installed in front of homes during major projects over the last 20 years.

**Pump Stations**: one at Woolbright, one at Tropical. Each have 5 pumps with generators and are connected to SCADA system. It was unclear if wet wells are inspected by Public Works or Engineering. **Exfiltration trench**: at Town Hall self-contained, does not discharge. Installed in 2008.

**SOP:** SOP states Public Works performs continual checks include storm drains, outfalls and pump stations. SOP also states all catch basins, outfalls, pipes, swales, ditches and pump stations are inspected quarterly by Engenuity group.

## **Structural Control Inspections:**

- Public Works (David Johnson) daily inspects top of storm grates for debris. If flooding or backups noted, will also inspect outfalls. Inspecting major outfalls more regularly, due to backups caused by algae or barnacles which may block flap gates in access manholes. Reviewed tracking, which included week dates, initials, and actions, usually "cleared vegetation/debris." Also note flooding on specific roads or impacts from construction. Inspection tracking does not include types of activities/structures inspected.
- Public Works quarterly inspects inside catch basins for sediment, vegetation, outfalls when accessible at the seawall. Not documenting in depth quarterly inspections. Pump stations: look at wet well once or twice a year; inspected more pre- and post- storm. Not documenting.
- Town Engineer (Lisa, Engenuity Group) is onsite weekly and drives sections of Town. Town staff also respond to citizen complaints for Town, FDOT and private stormwater systems.
- Reviewed maintenance invoices: Rockline Vac Systems performs maintenance as needed. Includes TV and Vac truck, grout repair of catch basin. Barnacle Busters cleans barnacles off the outfalls for tidal flaps and Red Valves. Cleaning twice a year.
- The Town is also having TeleVac South to TV all pipes, which will be reported in Year 2.

## **Required Improvements:**

- In future annual reports, report the Town MS4 current inventory, including retention systems, swales, solid pipe and exfiltration.
- Within 30 days of the audit report, update the structural control inspection SOP, including inspection checklists for each type of stormwater structure (Catch basins and pipes; swales (miles or sections); Dry Detention system, and Pump Stations. Each checklist should have at a minimum the Structure ID, date inspected, sediment/vegetation, structural integrity, maintenance needed, signs of illicit discharge.
